

- The planned Neurosciences Institute at NCH will be a regional and global hub for high-acuity neurological care, enhancing local access to world-class treatments. Key features of the new facility include a 24-bed neuro-critical care unit, six advanced operating rooms, and simulation labs for training health professionals.
- The John M. Boler Center for Rehabilitation at NCH provides a comprehensive, 33-bed acute inpatient rehab unit with all private rooms. The center offers awardwinning, personalized care aimed at ensuring a safe and independent transition back to the community.
- Deeply tied to its community, NCH originated as the dream of a grassroots campaign in 1957 that rallied local residents to fund and build the hospital in Arlington Heights.
- NCH is grateful for the robust volunteer program that supports its mission. In 2023, 380 volunteers provided 46,275 hours of volunteer service at NCH.

### Our hospital is an economic engine for the local economy:

- Nearly \$1.2 billion contributed by Northwest Community Hospital to the local economy through payroll, capital and other expenses.\*

## **Additional Community Programs**

- Partners for Our Communities (POC) manages, in collaboration with NCH, the all-inclusive Community Resource Center (CRC) serving the northwest suburbs' low income, immigrant population. Name a social service and it's here: a food pantry, clothing closet, English tutoring, adult literacy, healthcare support services, early childhood and youth programs, older adult services, a full public library branch and much more. POC provides programming and coordinates the services of the agency partners housed in the center and NCH pays the operational costs. The CRC has approximately 150,000 visits annually and is embraced as a vital resource by the community it serves.
- NCH launched a Mobile Dental Clinic in 2003 and since that time has provided more than 44,000 patient visits, providing a value of more than \$12.7 million in oral health services. The clinic provides preventive and restorative oral health services to individuals who have an income at or below 200% of the federal poverty level or are on General Assistance or Medicaid.
- NCH partners with WomanCare, Greater Family
  Health and local donors to ensure pre-natal care,
  NCH hospital births and post-natal support is
  available for underserved women in our area.
  Access to prenatal care plays a critical role in healthy
  pregnancies and this program is leading to more
  healthy deliveries among our underserved residents.

## **Community Investment Fund**

The Community Investment Fund is a dedicated resource aimed at fostering health and wellness, addressing social determinants of health and creating equitable access to quality healthcare within our community. By strategically allocating these funds, we support local initiatives, partnerships and non-profit organizations that respond to priority community health needs. In addition to financial support, we serve as a convener for community organizations, fostering a collaborative environment where the collective impact of our partnerships is greater than the sum of their parts.
